Choro (pronounced "shoro") is a musical genre in Brazil that blends European melodic and harmonic traditions with African rhythms. Classical and jazz musicians who are proficient with an instrument will build skills and find inspiration in this extended-weekend workshop. Enjoy instruction and demonstrations from six of the world's top Choro musicians. Those musicians are masters of clarinet, saxophone, accordion, guitar, keyboard and percussion. They perform in a Saturday concert that sells out every year, so reserve your seats early!




